beaches and modern tourist facilities, elements that have for decades made it a one of the most popular tourist destinations both nationally and worldwide. The capital of the «island of Knights» is at the northern tip; and is rightfully considered one of the most beautiful cities in the world. The beauty of the island however is not just restricted to the capital. Explore this beautiful island and you will be rewarded with quaint villages, spectacular beaches and impressive relics of the past, captivating your interest. Ialysos, Kamiros, Faliraki, the Kallithea Springs, the Valley of Butterflies, south Rhodes or Prasonisi at its northern tip are all places worth visiting. On the southeast coast and fifty five kilometers from the capital lies the picturesque village of Lindos, with its narrow cobbled streets and Captains' Manors, which is why this village has been declared a landmark. Standing on the top of a one hundred and sixteen meter high cliff is the Acropolis of Lindos with the Temple of Athena Lindia from the 4th century, which you can tour either on foot or by renting one of the donkeys from the town square.

There are many monuments attesting to Rhodes' rich history. Many and different civilizations have all left their mark on the island. The most important of these is the Medieval City which in 1988 was designated by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site. The imposing Medieval Castle, through which the life of the Old City unfolds, the Byzantine temples, the Knights' buildings, the stone paved streets, the mosques, the Jewish synagogue, the orthodox churches, the squares, traditional shops, all come together with their different cultures and civilizations, forming a complex mosaic. Rhodes had rapid tourist growth. The temperate climate with the year-round sunshine in combination with the island's natural beauty, the monuments and the infrastructure that was developed, have made Rhodes one of the most significant tourist centers of the Mediterranean.

Rhodes is the largest island of the Dodecanese and the fourth largest island in Greece. Administratively, the island of Rhodes belongs to the South Aegean Region. It is situated at the crossroads of the two sea routes of the Mediterranean, between the Aegean Sea and the coasts of the Middle East. Rhodes current population is 117,000 residents. It is located 460 kilometers southeast of Athens, 380 kilometers west of Cyprus and 18 kilometers southwest of Turkey. Its breathtaking coasts measure 253 kilometers in length. The «Diagoras» international airport is located in Paradisi and is just 14 kilometers from the city of Rhodes. The island's port operates as a home port, which makes the island of Rhodes a gateway for cruise ships of the Mediterranean. Rhodes has been blessed with a beautiful natural environment, spectacular
